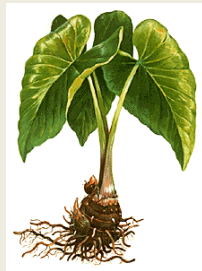

Embrace the Adventure!



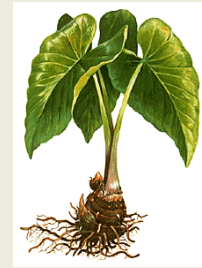

NATIVE HAWAIIAN EXPLORATION

Take a journey through the native Hawaiian lifestyle.



Monday: Introduction to Hula - learn about the ancient dance of storytelling along with Hawaiian mythology. Make your own ipu (gourd) instrument and learn about the many others that are used in this traditional art.

Attend the Old Lahaina Luau that evening to start of the week with a glimpse of what they will be learning throughout the week.

Tuesday: Excursion to Honokahau Valley & Taro Patch Cultivation – Help plant and maintain active taro patches while getting a glimpse of how the early Hawaiians lived. Learn the historical significances of this plant and take part in demonstrations on how it was used including the making of poi.

Wednesday: Limu Art – Take a trip to Napili Bay where we will call out and collect different kinds of seaweed and algae. Discover their common uses and which ones are edible. Then take the collection and incorporate them into unique pieces of art.

Coconut Leaf Weaving – The significance and many uses of the coconut tree will be discussed along with the demonstration and hands-on learning of coconut leaf weaving. Students will get to make a piece to take home.

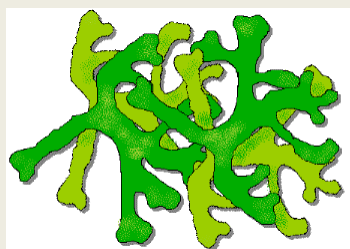
Thursday: Venture into Iao Valley – Learn the history and events that took place in this sacred valley. Also receive an introduction to Hawaiian native plants by identifying their species and learning their medicinal uses.

Make an imu (underground oven) – Learn about the ancient art of cooking under ground. Gather banana leaves, river rocks and other materials needed for the process and prepare to kalua a pig underground!

Friday: Celebrate the Unearthing of the Imu– Students will start the cooking process this morning and invite their families to attend the unearthing that evening. Small kine Hawaiian potluck with the kalua pig being the main course. This will also be an opportunity for the students to show their parents and family what they have learned and created during the week.

* Kumu instructors and guest craftsmen will also be invited to attend throughout the week.

Open to all grade levels. Minimum class size: 10 -if more than 10, fee will be slightly reduced

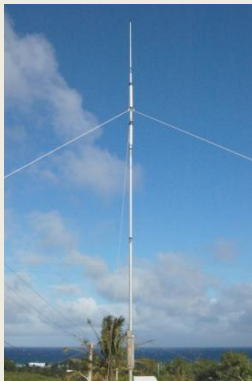
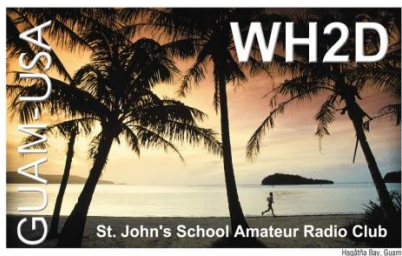

Amateur Radio

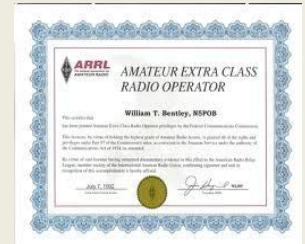


Learn Ham Radio

Space . . . the Final Frontier . . .

How old is the universe? What are Black Holes? How do we know so much about things on the other side of the galaxy?

This interim will explore the night sky from both historical and modern perspectives. We will work to understand how astronomy has helped people find their place on the planet, and their place in the universe. During our time we will use telescopes to explore the night sky (possibly including remote control of the 2 meter Faulkes telescope on Haleakala) and photograph our work. We will have a unique opportunity to explore Maui's place in astronomy with a personal tour of local astronomy laboratories and telescopes on Haleakala. We will make use of technology to contribute to the effort to identify extr-asolar planets and unique galaxies.

The interim will conclude with an overnight camping trip at Hosmer's Grove to view the stars. This interim will meet during the late afternoon into evening hours.

Let the adventure begin. . .

Prepare yourself for one of the most challenging, rewarding, and transformative experiences of your young life. We're leaving civilization behind, escaping into the silent, massive, and majestic spaces of the Hawaiian mountain. We're going into the Crater of Haleakala. . . .



For four days and three nights, we will explore the rim and basin of the Haleakala crater. We'll camp at three different places: Hosmer's Grove, Holua Cabin, and Kapaloa Cabin, each between 6500 and 9000 ft. We'll hike at elevation

each day between 4 and 6 miles. This trip requires real physical, psychological, and personal commitment. You'll need to be able to trek with all your gear on your back (20—30 pounds) at elevation (6500-1000 ft) for 3-6 hours a day. It may be one of the hardest, yet most gratifying experiences of your life. The weather will be unpredictable, but we will be prepared for air temperatures in the forties during the day, and near freezing at night.



We will carry all our food, clothes, and sleeping gear. We will reside in cabins for two nights and tents for one. Mr. Casco and Mr. O'Riordan are thrilled to lead this trip to the summit of Maui. Are you ready for the challenge?



Requirements: Positive attitude, love of nature, toughness, curiosity. This trip is open to all students grades 6-12, but preference will be given to high school students.

Cost: \$100
